India generates tonnes of garbage each day. This garbage is mixed with biodegradable and non-biodegradable items. The unsegregated waste that collects over the years releases vast amounts of greenhouse gases like methane that are harmful for the environment. It also contaminates the soil and ground water. Ironically, a lot of this harmful garbage can actually be put to good use if it is segregated at the disposal stage. Here's where every citizen can take small steps that can have an enormous positive impact on the environment. Waste management means separating dry garbage from wet. Dry waste consists of inorganic material such as glass, plastic, metal, etc. that does not decompose, and can be recycled a number of times.





India generates around 70 million tonnes of waste each year and most of the big metros are running out of space to dump garbage. The landfills are bursting at the seams with mounds of untreated waste. This is where segregation of dry and wet waste at source can play a critical role as it could drastically reduce the amount of garbage being sent to the dump yards. Additionally, the segregation of wet waste can be a rewarding exercise as it can yield nutrient-rich compost that can make the soil more fertile. Recycling diverts salvageable waste such as food leftovers, foliage, etc. from going to the landfill.

Here are some examples of wet waste: vegetables, fruits, flowers, leaves, pencil/wood shavings, hair, fish and meat, fingernails, tea leaves, leftover food, cooking oil, etc.



State-appointed agency Drishti Marine looks into garbage management, beach and marine safety and lifeguard services across all the beaches of Goa

Drishti Marine has deployed 250 employees who collect garbage along the state's coast to keep the beaches clean. On an average day, the agency collects around 2,000-2,500 kg of garbage. Since December 2016, it has cleaned up 9,00,000 kg of garbage.
